Colonel Claude Ellis, Jr., (Ret.)

olonel Claude Ellis, Jr. was born in Newark, New Jersey, June 21, 1939, the eldest son of the late Claude Ellis, Sr. and Lillie Gould Ellis. He joined Philemon Baptist Church in Newark and was baptized at age twelve. He attended Central High School and Newark College of Engineering before enrollment in Central State University in Wilberforce Ohio. He joined the Reserve Officers Training Corps where he was instructed in Military Science and Tactics by Major General Leo A. Brooks. Colonel Ellis received a Bachelors of Science Degree in Mathematics in 1962 and was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the Army in 1963. He also traveled to Indiana and married Carroll Ann King in 1963. Their son Craig Spencer Ellis was born in 1974. Colonel Ellis earned a Master's Degree in Guided Systems Engineering (from the Royal Military College of science, Oxford England, UK in 1977.

Colonel Ellis' military education included the Air Defense Artillery Officers Basic Course, Field Artillery Officers Advance Course, Guided Missile Systems Course 1181, Command and General Staff College, the Army War College and the Defense Program Management Course.

Among his important career positions; Commander of HHC Saigon Support Command RVN, Commander B Battery 2/51 Air Defense Artillery (HERC), Battalion Commander, Fort Cronkite, CA, Battalion S-3 and Executive Officer, Air Defense Artillery, (DUSTERS) Vietnam, Personnel Officer Action Officer, Air Defense, (MILPERCEN), Battalion Commander, 1/59 Artillery, 8th Infantry, Germany and Commander of the School Brigade where he served for an unprecedented thirty-one months.

Colonel Ellis' awards and decorations included: Legion of Merit (2 Oak Leaf Clusters), Bronze Star Medal (2Oak Leaf Clusters). The Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (1Oak Leaf Cluster), Air Defense Medal (4 Oak Leaf Clusters), Army commendation Medal (3Oak Leaf Clusters), Meritorious Unit Citation, National Defense Service Medal w/Bronze Star, Vietnam Service Medal (3 Oak Leaf Clusters) Army Service Ribbon, Overseas Service Ribbon (2) Vietnam Campaign Medal, Republic of Vietnam Gallantry Cross Unit Citation and the Joint Chief of Staff Identification Badge.

Colonel Ellis retired from Military Service in 1992. "Claude" became President and Founder of CETECH, Inc., an information technology, security, computer, consulting firm. It was in retirement that his commitment to helping others flourished. He enjoyed challenging projects and found creative and unassuming ways to mentor, lead and support people needing help. He was an "Omega Man" and his fraternity precepts resonated

throughout his life. Claude was gifted with the ability to construct, repair and improve furniture and any type of broken item. He liked sports chiefly basketball which he played whenever he could find a game. Claude derived pleasure from music and he played the alto saxophone. He liked gardening, scientific cooking and traveling the world with his beloved Carroll Ann and Craig. Claude was steadfast in his love and loyalty to family. He was proud of his brothers and sisters and their shared deep Newark roots. Still, he demanded much of himself and others. He was complex, competitive and still gentle. He was strategic and he had an uncanny wit that could both sting and soothe. When confronted with difficult situations he would always say..."I never had it so good." Finally, Claude was cool. He valued authenticity and insisted on simply being himself.

Above all, Claude was grateful to be a child of God and he loved to remind himself and others that ... "God has smiled on me."

He leaves as his legacy a life of service and devotion to the Almighty, a life of purpose filled with joy and love.

Claude leaves to cherish his memory, his devoted wife, Carroll Ann King Ellis, his beloved son, Craig Spencer Ellis; his sister Wakeela Rahman, of Plainfield, New Jersey, his sister Jamilah Allen, of Decatur, Georgia, his brother Ronald Ellis and his wife, Patricia of Oxford, Ohio, his sister Lorraine Wright and her husband Alvin of Suffolk, Virginia, and his brother Paul Ellis and his wife Yvonne of Goodyear, Arizona. Claude's other brothers Howard Curtis King and his wife Kathleen of Crown Point, Indiana and Emery Clarence King and his wife Jacquelyn of Lake Forest, Illinois are Carroll Ann's brothers who considered Claude their third brother.

Claude will also be remembered by a host of loving nieces and nephews and dear friends.








































We Remember Claude

WE REMEMBER CLAUDE






